

How will information be provided?

Hazards can occur suddenly and unexpectedly. Official warning messages provide important information on the situation: What happened? Where did it happen? What can I do?

The information is meant to reach as many people as possible. That is why there are different ways of spreading information:





What can you do?

Warning App NINA: Install the Emergency Information and News App NINA of the Federal Office of Civil Protection and Disaster Assistance (BBK) on your mobile phone. Add regions in the app to subscribe to hazard information that is relevant to you. Find out what to do in an emergency and how to prepare.

Tips for emergency preparedness are available in the warning app NINA or at bbk.bund.de/EN.

Cell Broadcast: If your mobile phone has Android version 11 or iOS version 16.1 (or later) installed, you can also receive alerts directly to your mobile phone via the Cell Broadcast service. Your device must be switched on and have phone service.

Radio and television: Almost all German-language radio and TV stations are connected to the German warning system. In an emergency, tune in to your local radio or television stations to receive up-to-date information.

How can you help?

Your contribution is important! You can pass on information – to family and friends, to neighbours and colleagues, to people on the street or on the bus. This way you can help spread news of imminent danger and everyone can prepare, even the people we could not reach via mobile phone, radio or other means.
